- -Cite the basic physics of ultrasound.

- -Compare the performance of the targeted obstetrical ultrasound in contrast to the limited obstetrical ultrasound.
- -Identify the uses of biometry in obstetrical ultrasound.
- -Identify the ultrasound signs for an euploidy in ultrasound.
- -List the basic principles of Doppler ultrasound in pregnancy.
- -Recognizing pregnancy of undetermined location (PUL)
- -Recognizing and knowing significance of subchorionic hemorrhage
- -Recognizing pseudosac, free fluid in abdomen and other signs for ectopic pregnancy
- -Identifying corpus luteum cyst in adnexa
- -Describe how to properly interpret/perform crown-rump lengths (CRLs)
- -Describe how to properly interpret/perform biparietal diameter (BPD)
- -Describe how to properly /perform head circumference (HC)
- -Describe how to properly interpret/perform abdominal circumference (AC)
- -Describe how to properly interpret/perform femur length (FL)
